Elementary Indoor/Outdoor Recess Policy

The following directive uses Canada's Wind Chill Index as a guide to determine when students should be permitted outside for recess breaks. We will use the temperature and Wind Chill Index as reported on the Environment Canada website: https://weather.gc.ca/city/pages/sk-32_metric_e.html

Policy:

- 1. If the wind chill index indicates a temperature which "feels like" -28 degrees or warmer, outdoor recess shall be conducted as per usual.
- 2. If the wind chill index indicates a temperature which "feels like" -29 or colder, the Principal or designate shall call indoor recess.
- 3. When indoor recess is called, *RCS Polar Bear Club* may be conducted at the lunch-hour recess if the wind chill index is between -29 and -35.
- 4. When the wind chill index indicates a temperature of -35 or colder, there shall be neither outdoor recess nor *Polar Bear Club*.
- 5. Parents will be advised that if their child is too sick to go outside, they are too sick to be at school.
- 6. In all decisions, the decision of the Principal or designate shall prevail.

Polar Bear Club Guidelines:

- This opportunity is meant for the lunch-hour recess only.
- An RCS teacher must be available to supervise students outdoors.
- Students must be in close proximity to the supervising teacher. (i.e.: a smaller designated area)
- If a child wishes to go outside and has a toque (not a headband or earmuffs), winter mitts/gloves (no magic mitts), ski pants and boots they will be able to join.
- The supervising teacher may send students inside whom they deem to be not adequately dressed/prepared for outdoor play.
- The supervising teacher will determine the length of time actually spent outdoors, within the limits of the standard recess minutes, shortening as they deem necessary.
